# Plein air painting Lee Ford Competition & Reception at Lee Ford





Dear All,

Following the re-instatement of the **Lindsay-Fynn competition**, Nigel and Heleen have very kindly agreed to allow us into Lee Ford to paint in the grounds this year to complete a picture from within their estate. The title for the Competition is *Lee Ford "En Plein Air"*. As this month marks 150 years that Impressionism was born this is a particularly fitting challenge; one of the lead Impressionist protagonists, Claude Monet, encouraged his peers to abandon the studio and paint outside in front of their subjects. This is our opportunity to follow suit in a unique, private (very few members of the public looking over your shoulder!) and varied setting.

The Lee Ford Estate extends to roughly 43 acres and includes formal gardens, semi cultivated ornamental woodland (May being the peak of the shrubs in bloom) as well as fields and the cottages.

We are invited from Wed 01 May to the end of June on weekdays - please avoid visiting during weekends and Bank holidays. We are extremely fortunate to be able to paint on the estate over this period. Please could you ensure you respect the two further requests for when we visit:

- 1. Please ring Angela at the Lee Ford office (01395 445894) with the dates and approximate time you wish to paint and confirm on the day from 9.00 onwards.
- 2. Parking is available along the side of the drive beside the house, but please keep to the tarmac and do not stray onto the grass verges.

The selection of the winner will be made by Nigel and Heleen at the Reception on Fri 12th July. As was the case last year, this will be restricted to circa 40 members (in case inclement weather forces it indoors). Details on the reception will follow in due course.

If not familiar with Plein air painting, below is an extract from Wikipedia.....so not gospel, but gives a good idea!

**En plein air** (French for 'outdoors'), or plein-air painting, is the act of painting outdoors.

This method contrasts with studio painting or academic rules that might create a predetermined look. The theory of 'En plein air' painting is credited to <u>Pierre-Henri de Valenciennes</u> (1750–1819), first expounded in a treatise entitled *Reflections and Advice to a Student on Painting, Particularly on Landscape* (1800),[2] where he developed the concept of landscape portraiture by which the artist paints directly onto canvas *in situ* within the landscape.

It enabled the artist to better capture the changing details of weather and light. The invention of portable canvases and easels allowed the practice to develop, particularly in France, and in the early 1830s the <a href="Barbizon school">Barbizon school</a> of painting in natural light was highly influential.[3]

Amongst the most prominent features of this school were its tonal qualities, colour, loose brushwork, and softness of form. These were variants that were particularly relevant to the mid 19th-century <u>Hudson River School</u> and to <u>Impressionism</u>.

## Art and Design in Theatre and Television as a Production Designer

From my first school play I loved the magic of the theatre! My art school experience led to a degree in theatre design. My career began as a Theatre Designer continuing to the BBC and a profession as an Art Director and Production Designer. A wonderful profession for 30 years, where I was responsible for the set design of many popular television programmes such as "Angels" "Howards' Way" "Two Point Four Children" as well as quiz shows, plays, light entertainment and childrens' programmes.

After leaving the BBC I continued an artistic pursuit, establishing a studio at the Canalside Craft Centre, Stoke Prior from where I ran my art gallery, workshops and gave tuition. Having recently moved to Devon I have now established a new art studio/gallery called Loft Studio, Libra Court, Fore Street, Sidmouth.

I work in various media, including pastel, watercolour, acrylic and oil and I have exhibited my paintings at numerous galleries in the Midlands and in London.

# Landscape Acrylics with Mark Warner Demonstration on 18th June Workshop on 19th June

Landscape (Acrylics) The idea is to take you through a step by step process in painting a version of the Landscape image you will have been given. Please put on your ipad/tablet or print off A4. We will look at composition, contrast and colour application. Please note, I will not have any copies on the day as I use my ipad. Materials List I will be working straight onto either A2 Watercolour paper/ canvas or



board. I will have sheets of this watercolour paper to buy on the day at cost price for £2 each if that helps. No smaller than A3. It is best to work a bit bigger for this. I tend to put a light wash of sienna over first. We will be using acrylics and the colours I would like you to have available are... Naples Yellow, Cerulean Blue (Important), Prussian Blue, Ultramarine, Magenta, Cad red, Burnt Umber, White, lemon yellow/cad yellow, hookers green. If you have some other colours that is fine too. A palette (I use a disposable one for workshops), cloth, water pot, softer brushes (a flat brush 16/18 and a rigger brush. A board for the paper and an easel if you have one. Other brushes are also fine. (Synthetic are best for this). Not stiff oil brushes








# ..and Finally
